This Sunday, we will be continuing our study on Moses' call from the third and fourth chapters of Exodus. Moses is called to do the extraordinary and yet, we will find that all along Moses has had all of the necessary relationships and skills to do what he has been called to do by God. Exodus reveals that while Moses is gifted, he cannot see it. While Moses is called, he is not prepared to respond.

After encountering God in the burning bush and hearing of his call to liberate the people of God (Israel) from the land of Egypt, Moses comes up with several excuses as to why he is not qualified. Here's a helpful hint, if and when you encounter the Living God in a burning bush - your answer is "yes." Moses' excuses are met by God's affirmation of who He is and who Moses is — meaning that together, they are both able to face anything that Pharaoh and Egypt may have in store for them.

Moses is called to go to Egypt, but he is also called to radically trust in God and in himself. Excuses are proof of a lack of trust. Join us on Sunday morning at both morning worship services as we explore Moses' excuses and how we as followers of Jesus can learn to trust in God and in ourselves. *Mike*


