Proverbs 11:25 says that a "generous person will be enriched and one who gives water will get water." This is the divine voice speaking to our very hearts. But our hearts are fearful and out of fear, our own internal voices say, "if I give, there may not be enough left over for me."

Our minds are well-versed in creating "what if" scenarios. What if our health costs go up? What if my stocks do not perform well? What if my company downsizes? We do need to be wise with our resources and plan accordingly. We need to save and invest. However, we cannot leave out generosity because it is the very thing God demands from each and every one of us. We are commanded by Jesus Christ to be generous in each of the four Gospel accounts of His life.

John Wesley famously instructed in a sermon called The Use of Money: Earn all you can, save all you can, and give all you can. Notice that each verb is followed by "all you can." We are encouraged to use our gifts and talents to be productive in our careers. And we are to be thrifty - saving all we can lest it be wasted on things that will not last. And finally we are to be generous. Exceedingly generous.

Wesley understood as Adam Hamilton says in his book Enough: "Our giving - both to God and to others - is actually a measure of spiritual growth, because giving requires that we trust God to supply our needs." Giving all you can requires a leap of faith that God will take care of us, giving us what we need (not always what we want). Our Safe Sanctuaries Policy seeks to provide a safe and nurturing environment for children of all ages within our church. In order to provide this to our children, we make sure that each volunteer has a national criminal background check and we ensure that there are enough adults to care for our children. We are about to amend our policy to improve safety and to improve our staff's ability to structure their ministries to our children. For the next thirty days, our policy and the proposed changes will be available in the church's main office as well as in the Welcome Center in the Narthex. Sanctuaries Please feel free to contact any staff member with your thoughts on the proposed changes. The Board of Stewards will vote on these changes in November.

The Firehouse Shelter will be having its annual **5-Alarm Gala** on **Thursday, November 7** at the B & A Warehouse.
