ENOUGH

Our church-wide emphasis Enough: Discovering Joy Through Simplicity and Generosity is in full swing! Last Sunday, our topic was "Waste." We saw how God blesses us and how we are to put His blessings to full use in our lives, in our families and in our communities without wasting those precious gifts of time, energy and finances on things

that will not last. And we were challenged to cut the waste and increase our ability to be generous.

This next week in worship we will look at what the Bible says about joy and happiness and how we seek it. We will study Luke 12:13-21 and learn about Jesus' teachings on contentment.

A few people remarked to me on Sunday that they had a desire to live more simply after years of feeling like they were trapped in this never-ending pursuit of more in life. Here are some steps toward simplicity that author Adam Hamilton suggests:

1. Set a goal of reducing your consumption and choose to live below your means. For example, you might set your thermostat back a few degrees this winter and use extra blankets. Instead of bottled water, try using a re-fillable bottle.

2. Before making a purchase, ask yourself, "Do I really need this?" and "Why do I want this?" Try waiting 24 hours before making a purchase and see if you still want or need this item.

3. Use something up before buying something new. Buy things that are meant to last and try repairing things instead of replacing them.

4. Plan low-cost entertainment that still enriches. Invite people over for dinner instead of going out to eat, or wait until movies come to the discount movie theater or out on DVD.

5. Ask yourself, "Are there major changes that would allow me to simplify my life?"

Proposed Changes to our Safe Sanctuaries Policy

Our Safe Sanctuaries Policy seeks to provide a safe and nurturing environment for children of all ages within our church. In order to provide this to our children, we make sure that each volunteer has a national criminal background check and we ensure that there are enough adults to care for our children. We are about to amend our policy to improve safety and to improve our staff's ability to structure their ministries to our children. For the next thirty days, our policy and the proposed changes will be available in the church's main office as well as in the Welcome Center in the Narthex. Please feel Sanctuaries free to contact any staff member with your thoughts on the proposed changes. The Board of Stewards will vote on these changes in November.

The Firehouse Shelter will be having its annual **5-Alarm Gala** on **Thursday**, **November 7** at the B & A Warehouse. The shelter's main fundraiser will include numerous basket raffles, hors d'oeuvres, music and more. Tickets are only \$50.00 per person (corporate tables also available). Ninety-three cents of every dollar donated to the Firehouse goes directly to services actually serving Birmingham's homeless. The Firehouse Shelter is Birmingham's only step-by-step network of resources for the homeless and provides short and long term housing options, street outreach programs, counseling, medical referrals and educational programs for the community. The Shelter also provides 450 meals a day and houses more than 175 men each night. The Effect of VIM Work: In early September government inspectors came to El Vergel to look at physical conditions for the students living at the school. The results came in during my stay there this week. Rosanna, the school principal, was excited to share that the school got high marks from the inspection team and she attributed the good results directly to the efforts of United Methodist congregations supporting El Vergel. Last year UM churches in Virginia shipped 150 new mattresses, a significant upgrade from what had been there before. And our BPUMC 2012 VIM work crew, especially Elizabeth Davis, worked to repaint much of the common areas of the girls' dorm, and it still looks pristine.

Thanks to our 2013 VIM work team efforts, the hostel is very close to receiving a favorable inspection result, because staples are now being stored in the separate pantry area built by our team. Samuel, director of El Vergel farm and school, is especially grateful for the funds you just sent for septic system repairs. One of El Vergel's next projects is replacing windows in the boys' dorm, and our missionary John Elmore will soon tell us specifics on how we might help. In summary, our prayers, funds, and relationship-building are making a difference. Could 2014 be the year that you feel the call to join the VIM team? Leonette Slay
