At Bluff Park UMC we receive our Easter Love Offering for missions during Lent. This offering supports ministries and missions that we as a church are involved in.

This year we will also receive a second offering for missions during Lent. The second offering is to support the construction of the Bluff Park Habitat for Humanity House. The Missions Committee recommended and the Board of Stewards affirmed the recommendation to finance and build the Habitat House as a congregation. This will be our local Volunteers in Mission project for 2014.

The typical cost of construction is \$50,000. However, we intend to raise a total of \$55,000 so that we can have a small cushion for unexpected expenses. The good news is that we only need to raise \$15,000 through the Habitat offering. Two donors have committed \$40,000 to the project for a matching campaign. When the congregation successfully raises \$15,000, these donors will contribute \$40,000. That means for every \$1.00 you donate to the Habitat House these donors will donate almost \$3.00. That is a great way to stretch your donation.

We are convinced that God is asking us to dream big dreams and accomplish great things in His name. The Easter Love Offering and the Bluff Park Habitat House are ways that God will use Bluff Park UMC to bless others and glorify God. Our hope is that you will make your regular donation to the Easter Love Offering and then make an extra donation to the Bluff Park Habitat House.


