Last Sunday, we saw that Jesus extended love and grace to "bad company" even while He was on the cross as he stated to the criminal: "Today, you will be with me in Paradise." This Sunday, we turn our attention back to his family and followers gathered together upon Golgotha (Calvary) to witness his execution. Included in this group of His faithful are the beloved disciple, whom is never named, as well as Jesus' own mother, Mary.

Mary watched for somewhere around six hours as her son experienced the agony intended to him as he died. It is difficult to even imagine what pain she experienced in these hours.

Jesus knew she was there and in an act to obey the fifth commandment (to honor your father and mother), He asked the beloved disciple to care for his mother.

However, it goes beyond simple caring for one another. Jesus says to them both: 1) behold your mother and 2) behold your son. Jesus is constituting a new family not made by blood but by our relationships through Him. On the other side of the Gospel, we understand this as "church." We are all brothers and sisters within one body of Christ.

Think of how we are connected to one another at BPUMC. We have Sunday School classes, small groups, women's groups, and prayer groups. We bond over barbecues and consignment sales. When someone is sick, a church member is there to help. When someone is in need of a shoulder, another church member is there. We celebrate birthdays and anniversaries together; we mourn the loss of a loved one together. Our first examples after Jesus in these relationships are Mary and this unnamed beloved disciple. May we ever continue in their example!


