Last Sunday, we learned how we are "nailed together" as a church through Jesus Christ. This Sunday, we focus on the agony of the cross in a very visceral sense as Jesus cries out to God in his pain, screaming "my God, my God, why have you forsaken me?"

As we face pain, suffering, and death, we often feel far from God as we ask God "why?" How, we ask, could a God who is good allow these things to happen? At these times we feel far from God just when we need God the most.

The good news in these times is that God in Christ knows that pain and feeling of separation. Jesus, as fully human, asks God his creator "why?" as he hangs on the cross. Our God chooses not to be distant from our pain, but to be there with us. Jesus "became sin" for us, Paul says, thereby taking upon himself all of the separation from God we have created and bridging that gap.

Even better news than God being with us in our suffering is that Jesus' suffering on the cross is not the end of the story. It is good news that our God chooses to be with us in the midst of our suffering. That our God transforms our suffering and gives us a hope beyond it is truly the best of news. We examine this Sunday the good yet awful news that God joins us in our suffering. We do this as we prepare ourselves for the greatest of news we will Peter hear at Easter. See you Sunday!
