## **COLUMBARIUM UPDATE**

The Columbarium here on our campus is a modern version of the old church cemetery. There's something comforting about bringing our loved ones to the church as their final resting place. Our Columbarium is a beautiful facility on the east side of our property. The first unit contains 96 niches. Each niche can hold one or two urns. To date, 54 niches have been sold, and we have had 7 inurnments. Two more are expected in the near future. A second unit can be added when the first is filled.

The cost of a cremation and a niche in the Columbarium is only a fraction of the cost of a traditional funeral and burial (cemetery plot, casket, vault, opening and closing of the grave, headstone and foot marker, transportation, etc). Family visitation and a memorial ser-





