Over the next two weeks, we will continue to take a break from a sermon series and will instead focus upon the Scriptures from the rich tradition of Christian history. The Christian calendar recognizes some important events from the Acts of the Apostles in the New Testament for the next two weeks. First, we read in Acts 1 about the ascension of Jesus into heaven after his resurrection. Then, in Acts 2 we read about the experience on the Day of Pente-

cost where the disciples received the Holy Spirit and it lead to the creation of the very first Christian church in Jerusalem.

These Scriptures for June 1st and June 8th remind us of the ending of Jesus' earthly ministry and the beginning of humanity's work of living our lives shaped by Jesus' way, truth and life. These passages lay out for us an important concept: **Jesus entrusts the work of his ministry to us.** We are, as Paul later says, the body of Christ. We, as that body, continue his work of healing, helping, teaching and guiding. We cannot sit back and wait for God to act — for God chooses to work *through us*. Join us at the start of June as we explore these topics!

We as a church have so much going on this summer. Please read through this newsletter and see all that we

have to offer, including ways in which you can serve others as a

member of the body of Christ!

TIME TO REUPHOLSTER THE CHOIR

It's hard to believe, but 15 years have passed since we last purchased robes for the choir. If you sit in the front row you might notice a few loose threads. The time has come for an upgrade. We will be purchasing new robes for the choir, the acolytes, and the bell ringers. Approximately 100 in all, and we need your help.

Each robe set consists of one robe plus two reversible stoles. The cost of replacing the robes and purchasing new choir folders is approximately \$25,000 (\$220 per set.) The choir members have already contributed \$2000 and the Endowment Fund committee has approved \$5,000 for this project. We need to raise an additional \$18,000.
