NORTH ALABAMA ANNUAL CONFERENCE June 2-4 Birmingham-Southern College

The North Alabama Conference will begin its 144th annual session on Sunday afternoon will Bishop Debra Wallace-Padgett presiding. Meetings will be held in the Battle Coliseum on the campus of Birmingham-Southern College. Lay and clergy delegates from around 800 local churches scattered across the northern half of the state will gather to worship and to conduct the business of the Conference. The theme of the Conference is **CULTIVATE: NEW IN CHRIST.**

Bluff Park will be represented by Lay Members Kathryn Coltrane and Charlie Trucks, with Lois Truss and Becky Walker as Reserve Members. Reid Crotty, Peter von Herrmann, Tom Duley, Tom Roberts, and Wayne Williams are Clergy Members.

The Opening Celebration and Communion Service will be held at 7:00 on Sunday evening, with Bishop Wallace-Padgett preaching. There will be a large mass choir of singers from several churches in the Birmingham area. Everyone is invited to attend. The Opening Celebration will be our evening worship service on June 2.

The Ordination Service for new ministers will take place on Monday evening at 7:00 at Vestavia Hills UMC. Our Youth Praise Team will participate in the Battle of the Bands along with other groups from across the Conference. The Conference will close with the fixing of pastoral appointments for the coming year on Tuesday afternoon at 4:00. All sessions are open to the public.

The Conference will receive reports from a wide range of institutions, agencies, Boards and committees. There will be Bible Study and worship. Clergy and spouses who died over the past year will be remembered. And new ministers will be received, recognized, and ordained. There's nothing quite like a Methodist Annual Conference!

Bluff Park UMC Garden Tour


