WELCOME MIKE HOLLY **OUR NEW SENIOR MINISTER**



For the first time in 22 years, BPUMC has a new Senior Minister. Mike Holly will assume the position on June 12. We are thrilled to welcome him and look forward to his ministry with us.

Mike grew up in Aiken, South Carolina and graduated from the University of South Carolina. He received his Master of Divinity degree from the Divinity School of Duke University. At Duke, he met his wife Julie, who is also a pastor. Julie is from Huntsville, and they decided to make North Alabama their home Conference.

Following graduation from Duke in 2004, Mike was appointed as Associate Pastor and Youth Director at Trussville First UMC. In December, 2006, he became Associate Pastor at Canterbury UMC in Mountain Brook, where he currently serves as Minister of Contemporary Worship.

After serving as Associate Pastor at Huffman UMC for 4 years, Julie has served for the past 5 years as Senior Minister at Discovery UMC. She will now move to Canterbury to take the position Mike is leaving. The Hollys have two children, Lena (age 7) and Davis (age 5).

Along the way, Mike served on the staff of the Lake Junaluska Assembly and was a Campus Minister Intern at the Wesley Foundation at the University of North Carolina, Chapel Hill. He will bring fresh energy and creativity to our congregation.

Mike's first Sunday at Bluff Park will be June 16. He will preach at both the 8:45 and 11:00 morning worship services. Let's fill the sanctuary to welcome him. There will be a reception for the Holly family on June 30. Everyone is invited and encouraged to come and meet them.

On Sunday, June 9, Bluff Park United Methodist said goodbye to our Senior Minister. Reid Crotty spent the last 22 years, approximately half of his ministry career, at Bluff Park. Here are a few highlights of his career:

- During his years at Bluff Park, Reid estimates that he has officiated about 600 funerals, married about 400 couples and baptized about 500 babies.
- The Bluff Park Membership has increased 1,145 people during his time here.
- The church has completed several building programs under his leadership resulting in a beautiful new sanctuary, children's area, fellowship hall and the elevator tower which now allows elevator access to all three levels. We have built a columbarium, added a number of acres to our campus, added much needed additional parking, built a new children's playground and on Sunday, dedicated the Bluff Park Promise Home which has been one of Reid's dreams.

At the retirement party on Sunday evening, the church presented Reid a memory quilt containing signatures of the members of Bluff Park, a book of notes written during the retirement party and a monetary gift for Reid and Martha to take those long awaited vacations. Words cannot adequately express our love and appreciation, so we will simply say, Thank you.
