

This past Sunday, Rev. Tom Duley gave a wonderful sermon on Holy Communion as an opportunity for each and every one of us to recognize and then join in to the abundant living that Jesus show us in his life and teaching. Next Sunday, I will be preaching on the fifth dimension of abundant living: praying always.

Praying always, or "praying without ceasing" as it is referred to in Scripture, is a difficult concept for us to take in. Prayer seems to be a

time_limited event. There is a beginning (Dear God...) and there is an end (...Amen). Early Christians had prayers such as these. They would often pray the prayers associated with Judaism such as the Shema (Deuteronomy 6:4-9).

However, prayer is also understood in a radically different way. Instead of thinking about prayer in these formal and formatted ways, you can also understand prayer as an ongoing conversation with God, no matter what you are doing. I once encountered a pastor who would pray every morning for his wife, for his family and over his church. Each and every day, his hope was that he would treat each and every person he encountered with the love and grace of God. Praying each day helped him to remember that his words and his actions could either be used for God's purposes or they could be...well...just words and actions with no clear purpose and no clear direction.

If you have ever seen Fiddler on the Roof, you have seen Tevya live out this ongoing conversation with God - seeking help and assistance for those times in our lives where there is no clear pattern of what to do next. We must continue to listen and search for God's voice and God's way forward...even if our lips are not moving.
