I want to thank everyone for the wonderful reception in the Fellowship Hall this past Sunday during the Sunday School hour. My entire family felt welcomed and loved! I also want to thank the Rev. Peter von Herrmann for preaching on the second dimension of abundant living: reading Scripture.

This Sunday, I will be preaching on the third dimension: hospitality. One thing we have to remember about the entire canon of Scripture is that it comes from a particular context. Many of the cultural assumptions within the Bible come from a Middle Eastern context where hospi-

tality is expected and demanded of each person. That is what makes the Parable of the Good Samaritan so scandalous: no one, except the loathed Samaritan, is living up to the cultural expectations of hospitality. Guests in the Middle East even to this day are treated even more hospitably than members of the host family with the best seat at the table and the best portions of food.

Jesus clearly calls his followers to live out this radical hospitality by becoming servants to others. The goal is simple: as Christians, we are to make every attempt to make friends out of strangers. This goes beyond "Southern Hospitality" as we learn to love our neighbors as much as we love ourselves. Think about how our team of Ambassadors, Greeters and Ushers work each Sunday to make sure that every visitor feels welcome in our church. Think of how members have given up their normal seats for visitors. Think of how Sunday School classes have opened their doors to new members. When we make friends out of strangers, we find that our lives become more abundant with grace and love as we are blessed by our new friends.
