Historically, Peter was understood to be the first leader of the early church. At the end of the Gospel of John, Jesus both restores Peter to a right relationship with Jesus after denying him on the night of his arrest and He instructs Peter on how he should lead the disciples in ministry after Jesus departs and ascends to the Father. Jesus gives three commands

to Peter: feed my lambs, tend my sheep and feed my sheep.

Jesus was criticized again and again for embracing the outcasts while he was healing the sick and restoring broken lives. He served others and instructed his disciples to lead through service. And Jesus taught tirelessly about God and helped people to understand anew what it meant to be a faithful follower of God, even if it meant confronting hypocrisy in the current religious leadership in the Temple.

Jesus fed and tended God's flock - the people of God. Peter is instructed to continue Jesus' ministry by leading a new community that would become known as the Church. As we gather for worship this Sunday, we will discuss how the Church should continue to do the works of Jesus.
