

Laity Sunday 2013

The term "laity" might sound odd to many, but the word comes from the biblical Greek word "laos" meaning "the people at large." In the Church, the laity are all the people who are not ordained clergy. What is interesting about the history of the Church throughout history is that the laity have been the ones to do much of the mission and ministry and not the clergy. Clergy tend to organize the church and tend to the Sacraments, while the laity have been on the front lines demonstrating their faith in word and deed.

One example of a great lay leader in the early church is that of Lydia in Acts 16. Our children are currently studying about Lydia and other female church leaders from the New Testament in their Sunday school classes. Lydia used her resources and influences in the community to help establish a church in Philippi along with the apostle. Once he left to go and start other communities of faith, it is likely that the church in Philippi continued under her leadership.

This Sunday is Laity Sunday and we will have several church leaders serving in worship this coming Sunday. I hope you will come out and support them and hear the wonderful words they have to share with us.


I hope you will join us in the coming weeks as we look at how we can manage our financial resources and truly experi-


