



Enough: Discovering Joy Through Simplicity and Generosity

Stress, Anxiety, Fear: These words capture well the state of mind of many of us in America today. A recent survey found that over three in four Americans are stressed about the economy and their personal finances. Half were worried about providing for their family's basic needs. Over half of respondents reported feeling angry and irritable, and reported lying awake at night worried about this. The report concludes that, "The declining state of the nation's economy is taking a physical and emotional toll on people nationwide."

Join us in worship this October for a sermon series entitled *Enough: Discovering Joy Through Simplicity and Generosity*. Over the course of four weeks, we will explore what the Bible teaches us about financial management through corporate worship and small group study. Each week we will provide you with some practical tools you can use to assess your financial situation and develop a financial plan with a biblical foundation.

1. Do you have to make a required minimum distribution (RMD) from your IRA in 2013?

2. Are you at least $70\frac{1}{2}$ years old or will be at the time you take your RMD?

If you answered yes to **both** of these questions, some or all of your RMD can be made directly to the church and it will not be included in income on your 2013 tax return through the IRS Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) provision. (If you choose the QCD option, there will be no charitable contribution associated with the gift.) The QCD option may save you taxes directly through a lower taxable income and indirectly through taxable income exclusions or deductions based on your income. If you think you qualify for a QCD please contact your personal Tax Advisor. Thanks for your consideration
