Every church that wishes to fulfill its calling in the world has to come to terms with its identity and purpose. We sing that the Church's one foundation is Jesus Christ, our Lord. Notice the last question? To whom does the Church belong? It does not belong to any one of us. It belongs to Jesus and our identity is solely built upon His calling for us as a Church. I invite you to join us this month as we consider how we as a congregation can continue to grow in becoming a church solely built upon the one foundation of Jesus Christ, our Lord!
