ne of the themes that is often neglected in the New Testament is the theme of movement. From the very beginning of Jesus' life, Mary and Joseph have to move from their homes and travel back to Bethlehem due to a census. Then, Matthew tells us that Mary and Joseph have to sneak their young child off to the land of Egypt where their own people were enslaved in order to protect Jesus from the murderous King Herod. And once Jesus begins his ministry, he is constantly on the move. He travels from village to village in the area of the Sea of Galilee and then finally he sets his eyes on Jerusalem and journeys to the place where he will be rejected. The final steps of Jesus' earthly life were the steps towards Golgotha which are called the Via Dolo-

rosa, or the Way of Suffering. Jesus was constantly on the move. He did not stay in one place asking people to come to him to hear about what God was going to do for the world. No, Jesus went to the people because he loved us and sought to tell us all who he was and why he mattered and how his life was our example of how to serve the world in love.

This theme of movement continued as apostles like Peter and Paul hit the road to spread the good news about Jesus around the Mediterranean. You see, the good news about Jesus is too important to keep to ourselves. The good news of Jesus offers life transformation and gives us all a purpose and a way of transforming the world around us. Thriving churches do not simply exist for the people who are already present, but turn their churches inside out seeking to help all people to find all of these things through faith and service. Our church has spent a lot of time and prayer preparing a document to help us continue our long tradition of being the kind of church that loves our community while also seeking to grow in our ability to welcome, connect and assist God in the transformation of folks in our community. I hope that you will go to our website and look at our Vision Steering Proposal and pray for the ways in which you might be instrumental in helping us to reach our goals. The Board of Stewards will consider this proposal on Sunday, July 31, at 4:00 pm.


Climate Justice: A Call to Hope and Action
