This Sunday, we begin a ten week study on the New Testament letters of 1st and 2nd Corinthians. This study will explore how the Church exists as a community of people who follow Jesus Christ and live out their faith. The author of these two letters is believed to be Paul, the former Pharisee turned missionary and evangelist who planted new churches throughout the Mediterranean. And in these letters, Paul gives guidance to the church in Corinth on various matters such as this Sunday's topic: "A House Divided."

Paul describes how the church in Corinth had become divided upon allegiances to certain apostles and teachers. They were up in arms about different perspectives. These divisions were putting the entire church into a dangerous situation where people might start leaving to form splinter congregations

around these teachers.

But then Paul asks an important question in 1 Corinthians 1:13: "Has Christ been divided?" He reveals to them that the Church is a community founded around Jesus Christ and not around a preacher or teacher. Churches routinely find themselves in disagreements about practices or policies or teachings, but the aim is to maintain unity based upon the essentials. John Wesley, the founder of Methodism, asked questions in his sermon "The Catholic Spirit" that are helpful. He essentially asks others: "Is your heart with God?" "Do you believe in Jesus Christ?" "Do you love your neighbor?" "Do you show your love by works?"

If we can rally around how we are united as church by a loving God, we can learn to live as a community that reflects God's intent for all humanity to the world.

Malaria's Dirty Dozen

Fact Three: Malaria was a disease of the American South well into the 20th century. In 1946, the U.S. Health Service created the Communicable Disease Center in Atlanta, rather than D.C., because the South had the highest malaria transmission rate in the U.S. By 1951 malaria was considered eliminated in this country but the Center for Disease Control still keeps a staff dedicated to malaria surveillance. The anopheles mosquito, present in the U.S., is capable of transmitting malaria so we have a risk that malaria transmission can resume here.
