As we move into the month of July, we are focused as a congregation on the nature of a church as a community of folks who dedicate their lives to loving God and loving others. We are also raising awareness in July and in August about malaria and how it is causing unneeded pain and death, especially on the continent of Africa. We are preparing as a congregation to respond to this missional emphasis in the fall.

As I look back upon the month of June, I realized that the North Alabama UMC's Annual Conference was an intersection of these two emphases: community and seeking to aid in the treatment and prevention of malaria. Annual Conference is the gathering of clergy and delegates from each church to wor-

ship, celebrate, learn and legislate for the sake of the United Methodist Churches within our area.

We discovered that in the past year we had 2,056 professions of faith and 1936 baptisms out of all the churches combined. We heard that we had 26,144 persons serving in missions that affected 763,255 people. And, the United Methodist Church in North Alabama took up its largest offering ever with a total of \$251,129.22 raised for our conference-wide initiative called "Imagine No Malaria." As of Annual Conference, the North Alabama UMC had raised \$911,035.96 toward its goal of \$1 million.

As you can see, Bluff Park UMC is a part of a larger community of people committed to loving God and loving others. May we ever increase in both of these areas!

Malaria's Dirty Dozen

Fact Four: Malaria occurs mostly in poor tropical and subtropical areas where it may be the number one cause of illness and death. The most vulnerable groups are young children who have not yet developed immunity to malaria and pregnant women whose immunity is decreased by pregnancy. For perspective, the World Health Organization reports that 3.4 billion people (half of the world's population) live in areas at risk of malaria transmission in 106 countries and territories. Malaria exacts a huge cost on stricken individuals, their families, communities, and nations.
