We have been reading through the book of 1 Corinthians since the end of June and thus far we have encountered a church dealing with a lot of problems. The Christians in Corinth have forgotten who they are as a community of faith and have begun turning against each other...and turning away from Christ. After chapter 11, Paul turns from answering questions about certain situations within the church and he begins teaching about what it means to be a true Church.

In chapter 12, Paul teaches that each and every person is gifted by God's Spirit. And as Rev. von Herrmann discussed in his message last Sunday, we are bound together. When one of us succeeds, we all succeed. When one of us

fails, we all fail. We are, as the Church, one body connected together through Christ. In chapter 13, Paul describes how love is the glue that holds the body together. This popular chapter is read at many weddings because of its poetic beauty and its truthfulness about self-giving love.

On Sunday, July 27th, we will turn our attention to 1 Corinthians 14 where Paul discusses the gift of speaking in tongues. This gift may be strange to us today, but it seems to be something important in the early church but even then they had problems. Paul reminds the people of Corinth that every gift, if it is a spiritual gift, must be for the building up of the body of believers. So you see, these chapters continually emphasize how important it is to get our minds wrapped around what the church truly is and how we are to take care of it and one another. We must be one; we must be glued together with love; and everything we do must be for building each other up in love.

Domestic Violence Outreach

The members of Bluff Park are ministering to the victims of domestic violence in a way that might not be obvious—donated wire coat hangers.

Many of the children who end up in foster care are there because of domestic violence in their homes. A Clothes Hanger Drive being run by the Home Improvement Sunday School class is helping to meet a need to provide clothes through the Jefferson County 'Clothes Closet' project. Malaria's Dirty Dozen

Seven: Over the last two decades research and development funding for malaria prevention has increased fivefold, from \$131 million in 1993 to \$610 million in 2011, with a projected need for \$8.3 billion from 2013-2022. What has this investment produced so far? The R and D pipeline now contains almost 90 products, including 40 drugs, with 10 in late-stage clinical trials; one vaccine candidate in late-stage testing; more than 12 mosquito control tools; and many new diagnostic tools.

for all kids that arrive at any time of the day or night. It is hard to have all different sizes or to immediately shop for a new child.

Jefferson County DHR is trying to revitalize their Clothes Closet to help ease this burden and we are asking for your help to provide hangers for this project. We are accepting wire hangers of all sizes (DHR handles newborns - teenagers) in order to organize the clothes closet so the kids and workers can shop as needed that first day/night/week to help clothe the kids during this initial transition period.
