We are on the tail end of marriage season in Alabama. While several couples do plan for weddings throughout the year, most couples tend to gravitate toward a window of time between late April and the end of August. When I ask couples why the tend to plan their weddings to occur before September, they usually give the same answer: we didn't want to plan our wedding on an Alabama or Auburn football game.

I have gleaned marriage counseling advice from books and mentors over the years, as well as from personal experience from my own marriage. With each couple, I discuss communication skills and tips for setting appropriate expectations. And we center on one important word: "teamwork." Successful cove-

nant relationships require that each person stay committed to one another. However, I always talk with each couple about another important word. Without this word, no relationship can last. That word is "forgiveness."



In each case, having the capacity to forgive and the ability to be forgiven are the key skills to overcome these scars and set our minds and our hearts back on the right path together.

Malaria's Dirty Dozen

Nine: In 2006 a Sports Illustrated column by Rick Reilly brought malaria and the use of bed nets to a national audience. Reilly challenged readers to donate \$10 to purchase an anti-malarial bed net. Thousands responded, leading to the creation of the Nothing But Nets campaign. The United Methodist Church was a founding partner in raising awareness and funds to purchase and distribute bed nets. Other original partners were the National Basketball Association and Sports Illustrated, and recent significant partners include the Boy Scouts of America. But, as we have learned, nets alone will not eradicate malaria. Therefore, in 2011 the United Methodist Church began an ambitious, comprehensive campaign called "Imagine No Malaria".
