The Gospel of Luke declares that God favors Mary, and that she has found favor with God. Gabriel, who had first visited Zechariah, now visits Mary and calls her: "favored one." What is interesting about this term "favor" is that in the Greek language, the word for favor is linked to the word "grace." You could almost stretch the angelic greeting to say: "Greetings, graced one." Mary is chosen by God's grace – not because of anything she achieved. There is no doubt in my mind that she is a devout woman, for Luke shows her acceptance of this divine mission as being more smooth than Zechariah's.

While Mary plays a special role in our faith and in human history, we must realize that each of us is not that far off from Mary. God could come to any of us and ask us to be a part of something new that He has in store for the world.

You see, Mary teaches us what it means to be ready for God's call. While she is still overwhelmed by Gabriel's presence and news, she understands that God's objectives and will are so much more important than our own. In order to be able to see and understand this, our hearts and minds must be prepared to receive this news.

As we read together through the first chapter of Luke's Gospel, and as we read the wonderful devotional written by our own church members, let us continue to make room in our hearts and in our lives for God's presence for both the small ways and the large ways in which He comes to us.

One of the traditional worship services of the Advent season is A Service of Nine Lessons and Carols. This service is a beautiful and inspiring way to hear the mes-


sage of this holy season. We will have A Service of Nine Lessons and Carols on Sunday, December 21st at 5 PM in the Sanctuary.


