Appalachian Service Project

Each summer, a team of students from Bluff Park UMC heads out to the Appalachian mountains to help families, living in extreme poverty, with household repairs. In 2014, they traveled to Green County, Tennessee and spent a week replacing damaged kitchen floors, digging drainage channels to prevent



water damage during storms, replacing rotting wooden porches and more. They provided a tangible expression of God's love in the lives of the families they served, and their work will be a blessing for years to come.

This mission work is possible in part because of the Easter Love Gift. In 2014, the Easter Love Gift provided \$1,319 to this project in the form of scholarships to enable our students to make the journey. It is one of the many ways in which the Easter Love Gift enables us to live out our mission goals of providing food, water, and shelter for those in need.
