e'll be concluding our study on Methodism this Sunday, May 10th, as we turn our attention to the mother who raised two of the main leaders in the Methodist movement. Susanna Wesley was the wife of Samuel Wesley who was a priest in the Church of England. It is said that "...although she never preached a sermon or published a book or founded a church, (she) is known as the Mother of Methodism. Why? Because two of her sons, John Wesley and Charles Wesley, as children consciously or unconsciously will, applied the example and teachings and circumstances of their home life."

Susanna was the primary source of her children's education. She ran a tight ship and made sure that they used proper speech at home and studied more than they

played. She practiced daily devotions throughout her life. She would conduct family worship services each Sunday where they would sing a psalm and Susanna would read a sermon. She really encouraged her children to be engaged in the faith and to grow in their service to others. She wanted her children to understand that faith that is alive and healthy is lived out in service and love to others in good works. And that will be the topic for us this Sunday in worship: the relationship between faith and good works through the lens of Susanna Wesley.

This Mother's Day, we invite you to see the influence a mother has on her children as well as how the little lessons throughout the raising of a child can lead to life-shaping and world-changing results.


