Potential

If you are a sports fan, you know that there has always been a lot of talk about potential. Potential number one teams, potential Heisman candidates, potential winning records, but, what happens when a player or a team does not play to their potential? Was this caused by a lack of preparation? Or did they decide they were good enough and could get by on past accolades?

The dictionary defines potential as possible, as opposed to actual. It is all about capacity if action is taken.

We have a great church and have done many good things, yet our potential is greater. Think of our Incomes

compared to the world, our location in a desirable neighborhood, the freedoms we enjoy, education opportunities, and the many technological tools within our reach. With these advantages, we can do more. Why are we here instead of a refugee fleeing a war torn country searching for a home and food, instead of an orphaned child living day to day scrounging for sustenance, instead of Christian minority in a country threatened by death to denounce our faith? I don't know. What I do know is that we are privileged and full of potential. I also believe to whom much is given, much is expected. Jesus conveyed this message by telling The Parable of the Talents (also known as The Parable of the Bags of Gold – Matthew 25:14-30). In this parable, a master entrusted three of his servants with various numbers of bags of gold – to one he gave five, to another two and to another one-"each according to his ability". The first two servants doubled what was given to them and the third servant buried his and did nothing.

"Dearest lord, teach me to be generous; teach me to serve you as you deserve; to give and not to count the cost."

In this parable, we could substitute ability with potential and see that two servants lived up to their potential and the third did not. Like the servants, we all have potential and also like them our abilities (or potentials) differ. I'm pretty sure I never had the potential to be a Heisman candidate.
