t is the start of a new year at Bluff Park UMC and that means a new year of possibilities as a church family! At the beginning of the year, we have decided to focus in our morning worship services on two themes. We began a three-week sermon series this past Sunday on "Breaking Bad Religion." We will continue for the next two Sundays as we try to determine what it means to have good religion as we compare it to religion that is void of meaning and purpose as it has turned inward. Then, starting in late January, we will move into a three-week sermon series on Forgiveness. We have so many instances in our lives together where we have damaged one another by our actions or by our inaction.

Forgiveness not only sets things right, but it also heals the wounds over time. This is true not only in the wounds of those we have damaged, but also in our own hearts as well.

My family moved into a new home in 2015 and I was told by the previous resident that the recycling truck only came every other week and only took items inside the large recycling bin. They would not, he said, take any other recyclables outside of the bin. I wanted to test this out, and did recently, and it is absolutely true. On Monday, they came to take our recycling and it is 3/4 of the way full now with recyclable materials from Christmas and New Year's. We still have two more weeks before the next pick up is scheduled and so, we will have to simply be patient until then.

In a way, our spiritual core is much like that recycling bin. It can become full very quickly with all of the distractions and to do lists that take our focus away from God. That is, unless we regularly empty our spiritual bin. What this means is that we as human beings need to regularly forgive one another and make amends lest our hearts begin to drown under the weight of it all. And like those recycled items which have great worth once they are mended, our forgiving one another creates a second chance and a new life for each of us. So you see, a life without forgiveness is cluttered in pain and filth, but a life lived to forgive is a life well lived and well loved.


#### VIM SERVICE OPPORTUNITY
