### I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink...

Samon Mary (in teal top) is a 33 year old mother of four. She lives in Katoth village in the Stung Treng province of Cambodia. Until recently, a shallow stream was the primary water source for her family. Water collection was difficult and water borne illnesses were common.

Katoth villiage now has clean water. Approximately 20 families, including Samon Mary and her children, will draw water from a new well created with the help of Bluff Park UMC Members. The New Light Sunday School class led the effort to raise the money for this project, which included last year's Fun Run. Combined with a contribution from the Easter Love Gift, we were able to fund the drilling of this new well.

The project was done in partnership with Neverthirst, a non-

profit organization dedicated to providing access to clean water in communities around the world. This is the second well sponsored by Bluff Park UMC. Thank you to the New Light Sunday School class and everyone who helped to make this possible.
