THURSDAY - FRIDAY, NOVEMBER 9TH - 10TH: ONE NIGHT FOR THE HOMELESS & VETERANS A recent study found on the Firehouse Shelter's website stated that the Birmingham Metro area has over 2,900 homeless residents. And around 20% of those are veterans. As winter approaches, they need basic supplies like coats, hats, gloves, socks and blankets. The students of Bluff Park United Methodist Church want to play a pivotal role in collecting these things from members of our community. On Thursday night, November 9th, students from their ministry will sleep outside in boxes with the hope of achieving three goals: First, to bring awareness to the plight and needs of the homeless in our community. Second, to collect needed supplies for area homeless ministries. Third, to share information on veterans' resources that are available in our community. Students will accept donations of winter clothing (gently used coats, gloves, caps, and blankets and new socks and underwear) throughout the night and into the next morning. Not only will students gain a brief glimpse into what it is like to be dependent on the help of others for their most basic needs but they will also collect much needed resources for others in our community. Supplies can be dropped off any time between Tuesday, 5:00 p.m. and Wednesday, 9:00 a.m. in the church parking lot.
