Message from the Pastor

I've been working with the LifeTrack Daily Devotional for many months now and I have found it to be very helpful to my spiritual growth to engage with the Scripture and to write a devotional that might be helpful to you.

Today, I'm hoping to convince you to read the Bible every day. Start with just this week: Seven days in a row.



Here are three reasons that I think you should that I found from a great author:

- 1. THERE'S INTERESTING STUFF IN THE BIBLE Don't ever let anyone tell you that the Bible is boring. If someone says that, they are not reading enough of the Bible. Noah's ark, David and Goliath, Samson and Delilah, love and marriage, Peter cutting off a soldiers ear, a dead man coming back to life... There are some incredible stories in the Bible if you dig deep enough.
- 2. THE BIBLE IS REALLY UNLIKE ANY OTHER BOOK the Bible is really a collection of 66 small books, letters, hymn and poems. It was written over thousands of years in three different languages. It was all collected, organized and preserved. We have the Bible because people copied it over and over again - by hand.
- 3. THE BIBLE HAS INFLUENCED THE WORLD LIKE NO OTHER BOOK - It has shaped preachers and church members alike. It has become influential to leaders, presidents and kings. It has influenced people who changed the world and who stood up for the least of these. How many other books can claim this?

I know it may be overwhelming to think about reading the Bible. but even reading for 5 minutes a day will help you grow in your faith.

Would you give this week a try? Seven days in a row???

- 1. I would start with the New Testament, specifically the Gospel of Mark (the first book of the New Testament).
- 2. If you would like to move throughout the whole Bible, try signing up for the LifeTrack Daily Devotional which is delivered to your e-mail inbox each and every day.

OUR BIG FRONT DOOR

The rhythm of life changes when school lets out for the summer. Students aren't distracted by school and have more time to relax and hang out. They also travel on vacations, so Sundays are often the time when they are getting back in town. We try to follow that rhythm in our ministry and plan lots of activities that allow our students to connect and have fun together, like dinners and game nights. These activities also create an opportunity to invite students from outside of our church tell them about all of the great thing happening at Bluff Park UMC. Already in June, we have had about 20 new students involved in activities who have never been part of our student ministries before.

One great thing happening this fall is the opening of our new building. This summer is a busy and exciting time as we get ready to move into our new space. There is a lot of work to be done. We have to furnish and decorate all of the new rooms. We have to move and set up equipment from our old Youth Wing into the new space. A dedicated team of volunteers is taking charge of this process.

Our new Youth Wing is a huge opportunity to extend our ministry to the students of our community. We are developing a new after-school program. We see this as a 'Big Front Door' that we can open wide and invite in students who don't already have a church home.









SERVING IN SUMMER

The summer break from school gives our students an opportunity to take part in more ambitious mission projects. July 8th marks the eleventh year that Bluff Park Students have set out on the Appalachia Service Project. That's over a decade of building ramps, fixing leaky roofs, winterizing walls, repairing flood damage, and building relationships and memories that will last a lifetime. Our group of students and adults will be serving this summer in Hancock County, Tennessee.

CHILDREN'S MINISTRY



We have already had a busy summer in the Children's Ministry. Our Camp on the Bluff was a huge success and we are extremely grateful to all of the volunteers who donated their time to give our kids a wonderful camp experience. Our campers learned about cooking, science, gardening, basketball, and cheering. And, each day, Mr. Stanley shared the basics of the Christian Faith too!

Camp on the Bluff was big, but VBS 2018 is going to be HUGE. We already have over 250 children from our church and community registered for our Vacation Bible School, and expect that number to grow before opening day on July 16th. We are in need of 10 more volunteers to lead children between activities each day. There is no lesson planning involved in this volunteer spot: you simply get to know, hang out with, and walk with a group of children each day! 


