Message from the Pastor

Summer is almost over and school will begin for most students in about 8 days. We are hoping to see as many people as possible in church on August 12, 2018. We will have some big events in worship and many Sunday school classes will start a new year together that Sunday.

Over the summer, I've talked to several new folks at Bluff Park UMC and they



have all said that what brought them to BPUMC was a personal invite from a friend.

It was not our website. It was not because of the yellow pages (do we still have yellow pages???). Sometimes, people say that they saw a video from our church on social media. Sometimes it is because they happened to pass by on Valley Street.

But most of the time, it is because they were invited by someone who shared positive stories about our church family.

I read a great article about three reasons that you should invite someone to church:

- 1. They might make a new friend. Friendship is one of life's great treasures, and the church is a great place to make friends. How cool would it be if you invited someone to church and they made a new lifelong friend?
- 2. They might be encouraged. They say only 20% of an iceberg is visible above the water. The rest is below the surface. People's struggles are kind of like that. You never really know what they are going through. They might look happy on the outside, but they are really in need of hope or encouragement. A simple invitation to church might be a spark of hope for someone.
- 3. They might meet Jesus. In the book of Acts, you can read about Andrew who brought his brother to meet Jesus. Andrew's brother was Simon Peter, who turned out to be a great Apostle. By far, the best reason to invite someone to church is that they might meet Jesus.

So what do you say? Who can you invite to participate at Bluff Park UMC? If you invite them, consider meeting them at the Welcome Desk in the Narthex or at the coffee station at The Gathering so that you can walk them personally to their seat for worship!

ROOM 35226

Each day there are students in our community who go without their basic needs being met. They may be out of dress code because they don't have enough clean clothes in their closet to wear each day of the week. They may be skipping meals over the weekend because there is not enough food in the kitchen at home. Or, it could just be that a student forgot to put on deodorant before leaving home. This can negatively affect their school performance. Whatever the cause, Hoover is too caring a community to leave these student's needs unmet. Many of us strive to help on a case-by-case basis. But what if we could do even more? Well, we can!

Room 35226 is part of the Bluff Park UMC Student Ministry's response to meeting these needs. The vision is to have a room at every school in the 35226 zip code stocked with school supplies, clothes, toiletries, and food. Students and guidance counselors will have access throughout the day, for any needs that arise. Each time a student takes something they need, they have the opportunity to post a note on the wall, not of what they took, but of what they plan to give back – to another student or to the community.

The first room was established at Simmons Middle School and we've already expanded to Bluff Park Elementary. We hope to extend the *Room 35226* program to the Green Valley, Gwin, and Shades Mountain Elementary Schools very soon.

On July 18th, Bluff Park UMC Students (many of whom had been VBS volunteers all day) met with Principal Cain at Simmons Middle School to learn about the needs that are filled through *Room 35226* and reorganize supplies there in preparation for the start of the new school year.

This program began with an initial monetary gift by Beav's Place (www.beavsplace.com), providing financial support to Christian churches and organizations in the Birmingham area to support youth outreach ministries. It continues through material and financial donations from our church and community. *Room* 35226 was the VBS mission project this year and they raised \$1,375.86 for the program.

The Children's Ministry has had an amazing summer! Between Camp on the Bluff and Vacation Bible School, we were able to host over 350 children at Bluff Park UMC over two weeks. Together, these children learned that God created them, God loves them, Jesus rescues them, and that they can share the love of God with others in their family, their community, and the world! Further, our children at Vacation Bible School raised over \$1375.86 for Room 35226, our Student Ministry mission project that provides school supplies, clothes, and food for students in many of our local schools who are in need of these items. All of these children and their parents will be invited back to our church on Wednesday, August 22nd, for a VBS/Camp on the Bluff Reunion Night, and our hope and prayer is that some of these families who do not have a church home would consider becoming a part of our great church!

Vacation Bible School and Camp on the Bluff would not have been possible without the love and support of everyone at Bluff Park who prayed for these events, volunteered at these events, and/or helped prepare for and clean up after these events. From the bottom of our hearts

and on behalf of all of the children: Thank You! We are proud to serve at such a loving, caring, and giving church!

We now turn our attention to the beginning of the new school year! During the month of August, we will be encouraging our children to start their school year off right with prayer, love, and encouragement through a blessing of the backpacks ceremony on Sunday, August 12th. Further, we will be providing our rising 3rd graders with their very own Bible, geared towards them at their age level, on the same day. Finally, Midweek Meetup will return on Wednesday, August 15th! Our Midweek Meetup Children's Programs allow children from 2 years old-5th Grade to spend each Wednesday night throughout the school year growing in their relationship with God through Bible studies, games, music, Bible memory verses challenges (with great prizes!), and more! We hope to see you at all of these great events in August!

STUDENT MINISTRY

The Summer has been full of "God sightings," as we call them at Holy Ground. Our Appalachia Service Project work teams built a ramp, installed dry wall, pulled down rotten exterior walls, and hung new insulation and vinyl siding. Two families in Hancock County, Tennessee will now be safer, warmer, and drier in the years to come due to the efforts of our students. Then on Sunday, July 15th, we walked through the new youth wing construction site. Students and parents were given an opportunity to pray over the space and then write their hopes and dreams for what God will do here on the subfloor before everything is finished. It was a very moving experience. Yes, summer may seem like a "time off" from the normal routine of the school year. But for us, it has been anything but that.

Preparing to move into the new building will be a major focus during the month of August. We will be going through the old Youth Wing sorting and organizing the things we will be moving into the new space once it is finished. There is a lot of work to be done, but it is an exiting time to be part of the Youth Ministry at Bluff Park.
