#### MINISTERIAL STAFF

The SPRC has requested that all three of our pastors be reappointed to Bluff Park UMC for 2019-2020; and, (thank goodness!) all three of the pastors have also requested to be reappointed with us.

#### RECENT STAFF COMINGS AND GOINGS

Going ~ Rev. Tom Duley resigned from his ministry roles in missions and congregational care at Bluff Park UMC in 2018. Bart Styes resigned as the Director of Student Ministries in the fall. Director of Senior Ministries, Fran Gatch, is no longer employed by BPUMC. Student Ministries Program Coordinator, Meghan Bohanan, resigned as of January 15, 2019 (she will continue to volunteer with the ministry).

Coming ~ After serving a short interim period, Art DeWeese has joined us as the new Director of the Sanctuary Choir. Student intern, Noah Glover returned to BPUMC this year, and he coordinates some of our mission projects along with other assignments. Stephen Ingram is the Interim Director of Student Ministries. Melissa Hendon, who is currently the Children's Ministries Program Coordinator, will expand her role to work also with Student Ministries on an interim basis.

# Message from the Pastor

Last week, all eyes were glued to the skies in the early morning watching for some promised snow to fall. A little snow did fall upon the church building, but it quickly melted in the warm sun. It was troubling to hear that some of the citizens of our greater Birmingham area took out their disappointment on local meteorologists. They cannot predict with certain accuracy. They can only forecast what the signs and models are describing.



In the Gospel of John, Jesus is not predicting who he is and what he has come to do. Jesus is certain of his identity and his mission. In fact, Jesus describes himself in wondrous and beautiful ways that help us to understand who he is and what he will do for us. The "I Am" sayings of Jesus are unique to the John's Gospel and during the Season of Lent in March, we will focus on these "I Am" sayings in the Traditional Worship Services.

Next, you may recall the financial reporting of our church family being a little troubling at the end of 2018. Our church, like so many others, operates from the generosity of the faithful members and attendees. Our Finance Committee and church leadership was prayerful watching and waiting to see if any action was needed. Our members demonstrated radical generosity yet again and we ended the 2018 year with a surplus. While this is wonderful news, that surplus did cover the deficit left at the end of 2017. This means that we are still a healthy church, but we do require continued generosity in order to offer programming and mission to our membership, our community, and our city.

Our Finance Committee would like to submit our 2019 annual ministry budget to the Church Council, but we are still waiting for about forty pledge cards to be turned in. We know that some of our membership had to wait until the end of the year or the start of tax season before they could submit their faithful pledge to the church office. I humbly ask each and every household to please do so as soon as possible so we can move forward with planning for a fruitful and faithful year of ministry at Bluff Park UMC.

Finally, I want to remind you that this is the third and final year of the 10,000 Reasons capital campaign. Our church family committed just over \$1 million to the construction of the ministry space that is now open for our student ministry. Our senior adults are also now using the gymnasium and we hope to open the ministry space beyond our church family in the coming year. While we are on track with giving to the capital campaign, we do need to finish strong so that we can continue to make timely payments to the necessary funds. Our church's financial staff is ready to help you if you have questions about where you stand with either pledge!

When temperatures drop, the city of Birmingham opens up warming stations to provide shelter for homeless individuals. Our Under the Bridge team is one of the first groups they call to prepare and serve meals to those sheltering from the cold. The Under the Bridge team served ham, mac and cheese, black-eyed peas, and corn muffins to 275 people on January 29th.
