## Message from the Pastor

Last week, all eyes were glued to the skies in the early morning watching for some promised snow to fall. A little snow did fall upon the church building, but it quickly melted in the warm sun. It was troubling to hear that some of the citizens of our greater Birmingham area took out their disappointment on local meteorologists. They cannot predict with certain accuracy. They can only forecast what the signs and models are describing.



In the Gospel of John, Jesus is not predicting who he is and what he has come to do. Jesus is certain of his identity and his mission. In fact, Jesus describes himself in wondrous and beautiful ways that help us to understand who he is and what he will do for us. The "I Am" sayings of Jesus are unique to the John's Gospel and during the Season of Lent in March, we will focus on these "I Am" sayings in the Traditional Worship Services.

Next, you may recall the financial reporting of our church family being a little troubling at the end of 2018. Our church, like so many others, operates from the generosity of the faithful members and attendees. Our Finance Committee and church leadership was prayerful watching and waiting to see if any action was needed. Our members demonstrated radical generosity yet again and we ended the 2018 year with a surplus. While this is wonderful news, that surplus did cover the deficit left at the end of 2017. This means that we are still a healthy church, but we do require continued generosity in order to offer programming and mission to our membership, our community, and our city.

Our Finance Committee would like to submit our 2019 annual ministry budget to the Church Council, but we are still waiting for about forty pledge cards to be turned in. We know that some of our membership had to wait until the end of the year or the start of tax season before they could submit their faithful pledge to the church office. I humbly ask each and every household to please do so as soon as possible so we can move forward with planning for a fruitful and faithful year of ministry at Bluff Park UMC.

Finally, I want to remind you that this is the third and final year of the 10,000 Reasons capital campaign. Our church family committed just over \$1 million to the construction of the ministry space that is now open for our student ministry. Our senior adults are also now using the gymnasium and we hope to open the ministry space beyond our church family in the coming year. While we are on track with giving to the capital campaign, we do need to finish strong so that we can continue to make timely payments to the necessary funds. Our church's financial staff is ready to help you if you have questions about where you stand with either pledge!

**JOB TITLE:** Director of Sanctuary Choir

### BRIEFLY DESCRIBE YOUR JOB RESPONSIBILITIES

I am responsible for preparing the Sanctuary Choir for leading Worship in both of our traditional services. We rehearse each week on Wednesday evenings from 6:30 on until 7:45pm. I have the joy of directing the Sanctuary Choir each Sunday morning as they sing a Choral Introit, Anthem and Benediction. I also lead the congregation in congregational singing each Sunday. I attend a worship planning meeting each week with Rev. Holly and Rev. Martin and then the full staff meeting which follows. I select the anthems, introits, and any music the choir sings each week, working to support the spoken word and scripture.

### HOW LONG HAVE YOU BEEN IN YOUR ROLE?

I have been at Bluff Park since the first Sunday of November of this year as the Interim Choir Director and now as the permanent Choir Director.

### WHAT IS YOUR FAVORITE PART OF YOUR JOB?

I very much enjoy preparing the choir each week for worship. Being able to take a piece of music and bringing it to life is very exciting. The relationship that develops with the choir is a very special one for me. Being able to share good times and more difficult times with each other as a church and choir family is important. Finding music that enhances the scripture and message each week is very rewarding and can be challenging at times. I am enjoying getting to know the staff and members of Bluff Park.
