Christmas @ Bluff Park

The Advent and Christmas season is an important and cherished time in the life of the church. We prepare to celebrate the birth of the Christ Child throughout the season of Advent with prayer services, a special Advent Sunday sermon series, our Sanctuary Choir concert, and special holiday worship services.

During the Christmas season, we also make time for mission activities like the Festival of the Three Kings, food pantry distributions, and the distribution of socks and blankets to the homeless that were collected in October. Our children bring the Christmas story to life with their annual pageant, and we gather on Christmas Eve for a moving candlelight worship service welcoming the Christ child in traditional worship and The Gathering.

We have made a few changes to our Christmas schedule this holiday season. Our Sanctuary Choir Director, Art DeWeese, will lead the choir in a Christmas Concert on December 8th. We have also moved the Lessons and Carols service later in the month to December 22nd.

Christmas activities in our children's area take place early in the advent season. On December 4th the Annual Advent Wreath Workshop takes place. On Saturday, December 7th, the children will take part in the Bluff Park Christmas Parade representing our church during this community celebration. In addition, on Wednesday, December 4 th , we will have our annual Advent Wreath Workshop for families of our church and community. Families that attend will create an advent wreath, eat dinner together, and receive an advent wreath devotional book that they will be encouraged to use during the month of December to help remind them of the true meaning of Christmas!
