CELEBRATING GIFTS AND YEAR-END GIVING

Churches typically receive as much as 25% of their gifts in the last two months of the year. As you make your plans to complete your 2019 financial commitment, here are three additional possibilities for resources beyond cash gifts. Please note that these possibilities are listed for educational purposes. Please consult your personal advisor for your specific information.

GIFTS OF APPRECIATED STOCKS OR BONDS

You can transfer ownership of stocks, bonds or mutual funds to the church and receive a charitable tax deduction based on the full fair market value of the securities on the date of the transfer. This avoids the capital gains tax while giving the church the benefit of the full value of the security. To receive this benefit, it is important to transfer ownership before the security is sold. For your gift to apply to the current tax year, the securities must be in the account of the local church (or our Foundation) by December 31st. So, allow plenty of lead time for your broker to complete this transaction.

GIFTS OF REAL ESTATE

A charitable gift of real estate can be especially tax advantageous. If a home, vacation home, acreage or farm property has appreciated in value over the years – its sale could result in a sizable capital gains tax. If the real estate is given to the church prior to the sale, you can avoid the tax and realize a charitable deduction for the full fair market value of the real estate. One could even consider a bargain sale transaction with half of the funds to the church and the other half to the donor.

GIFTS OF LIFE INSURANCE

When you name the church as the owner and beneficiary of a life insurance policy, it usually offers you a tax advantage in the year you make the gift. You can take a charitable deduction approximately equal to the cash value at the time of the gift. Additionally, continued payments of premiums may qualify as

CHILDREN'S MINISTRY

As Thanksgiving has recently passed and Christmas is fast approaching, it seems a great time to reflect on and celebrate the ways God has blessed the Children's Ministry at Bluff Park UMC in 2019. In the past year:

We offered 4 mission trip/field trips to teach the children of our church and community the importance of sharing the love of Christ with their friends, their family, their community, and the world. The 26 children who attended each field trip have shopped for and packed/delivered school supplies, Christmas gifts, food, etc. for people in our community and around the world who were in need of these things.

We offered our third year of Camp on the Bluff, a free skills-based summer camp geared towards children in our community who may not be able to afford to attend summer camp, as well as the children of our church. 60 children attended our first year (2017), 100 children attended our second year (2018), and 120 children attended this year (2019).



272 children attended Vacation Bible School this year!

The children of our church and community raised over \$1200 dollars at VBS to benefit Room 35226.

We continued to provide age appropriate Bibles to the children of our church at three key points throughout their spiritual journey: when they are baptized, when they enter Kindergarten, and when they enter the 3 rd grade. In all of our ministries, we continue to teach the children of our church and our community how much God loves them, how they can form a relationship with God through Jesus Christ, how they can grow in that relationship, and how they can share the love of God with others! God has truly blessed the Children's Ministry in 2019, and we could not have accomplished everything above without the help of such a loving and caring congregation. Whether you prayed for us, volunteered with us, contributed you tithes and offerings, or loved on the children of our church in any way, we could not have done it without you! Thank you for investing in the lives of the children of our church and our community, and thank you for helping us have such a great year! Merry Christmas!
