Worship In June

As we enter the month of June, we continue to worship online as a church. We anticipate returning to Sunday morning worship in the building sometime in late June, but no date has been set. Be prepared for a very different Sunday morning experience as we balance our desire to return to 'normal' with the need to protect the health and safety of everyone in our church community.

The safest choice is to continue to worship online. Even when we re-open worship, we encourage all of our older members and anyone with health issues to continue worshipping online.

When the church does re-open, our Sunday morning activities will be very limited. There will be no Sunday School. There will be no child care. There will be no valet service. Seating will be limited to every third pew to maintain proper social distancing and members from different households will need to maintain a 6 foot separation if they share a pew. Hymnals, Bibles, and pew cards will be removed from the pews. Singing will be limited, and everyone will be highly encouraged to wear a mask (if you need a mask, please contact the office.)

There will be other changes beyond those listed. To help everyone navigate this new Sunday morning routine, we will be training a group of volunteers to help guide and direct people through all the changes.

We are closely watching the number of active cases of COVID-19 in our area. We are also actively preparing to safely open our facilities. When a date is set to open the church for worship, we will communicate this information via email, on our website and Facebook page, and through Realm.

We truly appreciate everyone who has been helping us develop a plan to safely re-open the church.

Find Help

We know that many people are struggling during this difficult time. Our church family has prepared to assist members of our church and community through their generosity and their sharing of supplies and resources.

- 1. If you are in need of a cloth mask, please contact the church's main office and we can make sure that one is provided for you.
- 2. If you are in need of food, please contact a pastor or the church's financial office staff. Your name and information will be held confidential within that circle of staff members.
- 3. If you are in need of financial assistance, please either contact or visit our church's financial office. They will ask you for the appropriate bills and information so that our pastors can then assist you. Your name and information will be held confidential within that circle of staff members as well as with our church treasurer.
- 4. If you are in need of prayer or pastoral care, please contact the pastors through the Pastoral Care Line at 205-533-9902 or by sending an email to care@bpumc.org.
- 5. BPUMC is connected to United Counseling which offers mental health telehealth services. You can obtain up to 3 free sessions by contacting a BPUMC pastor first.

OUR MISSION WORK IN CHILE

Bluff Park UMC has supported missionary John Elmore's work in Chile since 2007. We are one of about 65 United Methodist Churches throughout the U.S. that support him as Covenant Churches. To be in a Covenant Church relationship with a Methodist missionary requires three commitments: 1) to pray for our missionary and his work; 2) to contribute monetarily to his work; and 3) to send a team at least once a year to work alongside of him.

MEET OUR MISSIONARY

John Elmore has done missionary work in Iquique, Arica, Talca, El Vergel and Angol (where he currently works). He is originally from Virginia but spent years in Tuscaloosa where he has strong ties with Forest Lake UMC. He met his wife, Cristina, while he was serving in northern Chile (her family lives in Arica). She is an English teacher in a secondary school and speaks fluent English. John was called to be a missionary when he was about 40 after spending years working in construction. His background allows him to ably supervise and work alongside mission teams doing construction work. He also sings and plays guitar and is a major part of the musical and liturgical programs at one of the three Methodist churches in Angol.

BPUMC'S MISSION TEAMS TO CHILE

Since 2007, BPUMC has sent mission teams to Chile to work with John in the various towns where he has served. His assignment in Angol is to renovate and revitalize the only Methodist camp in Chile. It will be used for spiritual retreats, youth camps, and church meetings.

The rustic camp consists of bedrooms facing an indoor courtyard, a dining hall, and bathrooms. Outside are small, separate outdoor worship areas set among giant sequoias which have grown from seeds missionaries brought from California. The camp is also an easy walk to the Malleco River. One of John's visions is to develop ecological studies at the camp, incorporating hikes to the river and study of local vegetation.

BPUMC's September 2019 mission team to Chile painted all the bedrooms, repurposed old bunk beds into nightstands, painted out-buildings and fences, and land-scaped the grounds. Due to COVID-19, we will send our next work team to Chile when it is safe to do so. Greetings from our Missionary in Angol, Chile:

Our United Methodist missionary in Chile, John Elmore, and his wife Cristina send greetings from Angol, Chile, a city which until recently was under a strict governmental lock-



down to slow COVID-19. Fortunately, Cristina's parents, from Arica in far northern Chile, were visiting when the lockdown was announced.

John is enjoying the BPUMC livestream services and uses his Methodist hymnal to sing along. One of the ads he is seeing on Chilean TV is "separamos pero conectamos" (separated but connected) -- a true feeling for our global community now.

As a U.S. Citizen, John received a \$1,200 stimulus check. Since he can't use the money to stimulate the U.S. economy, he and Cristina decided to purchase food staples for local families in-need. They packaged the foods for each family and included a Spanish-language Upper Room. This is another way that John and Cristian are making a difference in their community! Please continue to pray for John, his family, and our friends throughout Chile.





VBS 2020 NEEDS YOUR SUPPORT! Since so many local churches have had to cancel VBS, a group of Children's Ministry leaders in the North Alabama Conference got together to produce a "virtual VBS." The result is "Little Bugs Big Impact! Big and Small, God Uses Us All!" This format uses original content designed to be used in private homes or for small groups. Families will be sent links to videos and a list of supplies needed each day. The supplies needed are things found around the house already or easily purchased from a discount store such as Wal-Mart or Dollar General. Unfortunately for some, these supplies are still out of reach. Bluff Park UMC will be providing all the supplies needed for 50 children to participate as well as any supplies needed to pack them (boxes, bags, containers, etc.) The estimated cost is \$40 per participant (based on our regular VBS costs.) We are excited for what God is going to do in this next stage of our ministry and we are hopeful we can meet again in person soon!



ADULT MINISTRY

You might ask, "Are we looking after our members during this time of crisis?" The answer is yes! We have a team called the "Congregational Care Team" that leads the effort to make sure we are doing all we can to provide support to our members. This team was formally organized in 2018 under the direction of the Adult Ministry Council and our ministers. Included as part of congregational care are visits and calls by our ministers, flower ministry, card ministry and calls by church members as appropriate.

A major focus of the team is providing care for our members who are in senior living facilities or those members confined mostly to their homes. These are our TLC members, those in need of some extra tender loving care. The team also provides care and support for church members who are ill, have had a loved one pass away or who are celebrating a joy such as a new baby.

THE FLOWER MINISTRY

The Flower Ministry at Bluff Park Methodist began more than eight years ago and is currently led by Ellen Finley. The 20 members of our flower team make numerous vases of flowers from the flowers used in our sanctuary and deliver them to those in need.

When our worship services at the church were suspended because of COVID-19, flower team members volunteered to call and check on members of our TLC group. They will continue this outreach until we are once again worshiping at church and have flowers to deliver.

The Open Door Café

All Open Door Café weekly programming is cancelled until further notice.

THE CARD MINISTRY

This past year we revived a card team which had been active in the past. The card team is now led by Sula Hicks. This team sends cards to our TLC list and to members of our congregation as directed by our ministerial staff. Birthday Cards, Holiday Cards, Sympathy Cards, Get Well Cards and Thinking of You Cards. A large group of volunteers happily assist with this ministry. Recently, the team sent cards to our graduating seniors.

Our youth also help with our card ministry. At Christmas and during the COVID-19 pandemic, they have sent homemade or handwritten cards to our TLC group.

CALLS AND VISITS

Our Ministers, Mike, Angela and John Carl, visit members in the hospital and at home. Our Minister of Care, Wayne Williams, visits and calls our TLC members in facilities and at home on a regular basis. Our ministers are always available to help our members.

In addition to the members of the flower ministry, additional volunteers have continuously called our Open Door Café and TLC members to check on them.

How To Worship Online



Realm is an online ministry tool designed for real-time connection. It helps members of our church family connect with each other and with our staff. Realm is not like a social network that's open to everyone. It's only made up of the people in your church. Realm gives you control over what information you share and who can see it.


