Worship In July

Worship Online

On every Sunday in July, we will continue to offer two worship services online at 10:30 am. These worship services are recorded and edited together so that you feel as though you are right there in the room with us in the Sanctuary or in the Chapel. You can find the worship services on our website by navigating to bluffparkumc.org and look for "Livestream" on the top menu on the right. There will be links to the worship services online for both Traditional Worship as well as The Gathering. The best way to interact with both services is through Facebook Live where our pastors participate in the comments section each Sunday. If you have any issues with the worship service freezing up, we recommend pausing the video and waiting for a few moments or even tuning in around 11:30 am or later.

Worship In-Person

On the final Sunday of June, our church held a trial Traditional Worship service in the Sanctuary. It was a successful start to worship and we heard very positive feedback from the few people that attended the service. Our church members showed such love and respect for one another as they entered the Narthex, remained distant from one another, wore their face masks, and as they waved to one another. One person in worship at our trial service said that the Sanctuary and Narthex seemed to be cleaner than most grocery stores and businesses that they had visited during the pandemic! We will offer another trial worship service on July 12th, and we ask that you register either on our Realm online database or by calling the main office at (205) 822-0910. Please only register those that live in your household. Information about our safeguards will be emailed to you prior to attending the trial worship service. Each of these trial services is another step further down the road to being in worship together!

- 5. BPUMC is connected to United Counseling which offers mental health telehealth services. You can obtain up to 3 free sessions by contacting a BPUMC pastor first.

Message from the Pastor

One afternoon, I was walking through church during a howling storm outside. Thunder and lighting accompanied the wind and rain. These kinds of storms happen often during the hot and humid summer up on the bluff. But I am often in my office when a storm like this passes over us. I happened to be walking through the Nar-



thex and kept going into the Sanctuary. Inside the Sanctuary, I could still hear the rain and thunder and I could see the lightning. However, I had a sense of calm and a sense that God was present with me in this holy place. I don't know if our beautiful stained glass windows filtered out the view of the storm or if it was the nature of a Sanctuary like ours that provided me with a sense of calm. But I felt a sense of peace even during the storm outside as well as the storms we have faced during this pandemic.

I am not sure what storms you are facing, but I do know that God is present just as much as He was in that moment in the Sanctuary. For God is not bound by the walls of a church. God is with us where we are. His Spirit dwells with us as we live our lives. Sanctuary can literally be wherever you are! Think about how even your home has been a place where you could practice spiritual disciplines or view worship online. God has been with you all along.

I hope that you will continue to join us as we worship online or as we begin to open up our Sanctuary and Chapel for physically-distanced worship. And I hope that you will continue to reach out to our pastoral team and your friends at church so that we can remain together as God's family here on the bluff even during this long stormy season. The bonds between Christians are strong. We may not be related by blood, but we are, thanks to God, bound together by the waters of our baptism. We are knit together by water and Spirit and we are better together than we ever are apart.

May God continue to bless you and may God continue to help us through the storms of life.

Gardens on the Bluff Community Garden

Gardens on the Bluff (GOTB) provides a place, training and assistance for BPUMC members and members of the community to grow a garden. Each gardener pays \$20 per year for the year round use of one raised (4' X 8' x 10" deep) bed. Compost, aged manure, topsoil and water are available for each gardener. Green Team members lead by Jan Rogers also provide some seeds, fertilizer and ties as well as year around assistance, training and resources for new and experienced gardeners. Otis Bibb designed and build most of the beds and helps to maintain the gardens, pathways and compost bins.

Since it began in 2017, the number of 4' x 8' by 10" deep raised garden beds has grown to 25. All are being used this year and there is a waiting list for 2021.





Kaiden (age 5) has had a garden at Gardens on the Bluff for four years. According to his Mom, "His first daily request is usually, 'Can we go to our garden and have a picnic today?' He loves it there. It is like a treasure hunt when we pick our veggies. And it motivates him to eat the veggies -- he's grown!

He has met lots of people in the garden and we've learned a lot. This is our best season yet!!"

Children's Garden

A children's garden located near the community gardens teaches children to how to plant, grow and harvest fruits and vegetables. In doing so, each step is related to Biblical practices or verses. Currently the Children's Garden has 10 raised beds and fruit trees. Since the project began in 2013, groups that utilize the Children's Garden have included those who attend a summer garden camp, children from the Riley Center that come each Tuesday during the summer and BPUMC children who visit the garden one Sunday a month from April through September. Julie Adams leads (lead), Olivia Howard and Amy Montz work with other Green Team volunteers on this project. Funding for the Children's Garden comes from a plant sale that is held each spring.



CHILDREN'S MINISTRY

How To Worship Online


On Sunday mornings the weekly worship Livestream can be found on our Facebook Pages. If you aren't a Facebook user, there is also a dedicated page on our website where you can tune in live each week. The link to the livestream page is on the upper right of the website homepage and will take you to the Livestream page.

If you are not able to tune in to the live broadcast, the full service recording is available immediately after the service on the Livestream page and on Facebook.

Realm is an online ministry tool designed for real-time connection. It helps members of our church family connect with each other and with our staff. Realm allows you to manage your personal information and who is allowed to see it, control your giving, and keep in touch with the ministry groups that matter to you.

Realm is not like a social network that's open to everyone. It's only made up of the people in your church. Realm gives you control over what information you share and who can see it.

You can access Realm on the web or through a free app on your phone.

The Finance Committee approved a plan to apply for the Paycheck Protection Program put into place by the CARES Act during the early months of the COVID-19 pandemic. The financial staff of the church ensured that there is a transparent audit trail to track that the funds were appropriately allocated according to the specific expenditure requirements of the Paycheck Protection Program.
