Message from the Pastor

During the month of October, our church is going to focus on love. It seems like an odd topic for the month in which people decorate their porches and yards with jack-o'-lanterns, spider webs, and other spooky decorations. Maybe love is a better topic for Christmas or February! But we are going to ex-



plore what Agape looks like. What is Agape? It is the love demonstrated by God. It is a self-giving, sacrificial love. It is the kind of love that Paul talks about in 1 Corinthians 13: love is patient, kind, and it is not envious, boastful, or rude.

In his book Reckless Love, United Methodist pastor Rev. Tom Berlin says that Jesus shows us how to love like God loves. That is an important theme in the New Testament book 1 John. Over and over, the author reminds us that if we have God in our lives, we love others. If we do not have God in our lives, we do not love others. Loving others, then, is a very usual sign that someone is growing in their love of God.

I hope that you will use the month of October to demonstrate love to your neighbor. It's time for the people of God to show that God's love is still alive and active in the world. In such a time of division and anxiety, we need to be loved more than ever! My hope is that the words we read from 1 John in worship and the words we hear in our sermons and conversations this month will give us creative ideas for random acts of kindness or opportunities for generosity for our neighbors. Please pray for God to show you ways to demonstrate His love to others this month!

I hope you will join us in Traditional Worship or at The Gathering at Bluff Park as we talk about how "Love Has A Name."

Friends,

As many of you have heard by now, I will be transitioning out of pastoral ministry at the end of September with my last Sunday at Bluff Park being September 27. What a profound and enriching experience service as one of your pastors for more than four years has been! This church has been a remarkable reminder of what the Church can be when good folks get together to follow Jesus and love one another. I have been so inspired and encouraged to watch each of you use the gifts God has given uniquely to you to be a light to our community through the ministry of this church. Your words of encouragement, acts of service and support, and gifts of resources and time to support the work I've done here have been tangible acts of God's grace in my life. For those and so many other things, I am so grateful to have been a part of BPUMC's story.



Most of you know that my wife Tori is an ordained minister as well, serving at Canterbury UMC in Mountain Brook. We began to feel called to foster in our family the core value of community, where we are able to invest in the same place, worship together, and raise our children together in an atmosphere of worship and service. As we further discerned that call, it became clear that I was the one being led to explore new avenues of calling outside the church. Due to my undergraduate background in finance, I began to rehone my skills in the business world and will begin in October in the field of accounting.

In many ways, this work that we've undertaken as a family is no different than the work that I've asked our friends in The Gathering to take up as well: the work of discernment, following the voice of God into the world, and responding to God's Word as it comes to us through the Scriptures, through the liturgy, and yes, even through the voice of our community. God does not ask us to be static creatures that profess our faith in Jesus and are done but are constant watchers and listeners for God's voice, directing us to our next move, finding our next place to invest and serve.

I would be remiss if I didn't express my gratitude to Mike and Angela and Stanley and JT and all the staff at BPUMC. They have been dear coworkers and friends and are each insanely gifted for the work of ministry here. I am also grateful to those saints who gave so much time, energy, and heart in doing the work to start The Gathering, and who are also too numerous to name here. Finally, my gratitude extends to each of you reading this for your heart and spirit that you pour into this church. As I leave Bluff Park and pastoral ministry, I find myself encouraged and strengthened in my faith in Jesus Christ because of your witness and love. Whatever shape the world takes in the coming days, months, and years, I know that the people of this church will continue to be set on the mission of loving God and our neighbors here in Bluff Park and that God's work will continue here in this place.

Though you will not see me on Sundays, I am grateful that we serve a God that connects each of us together through the Spirit that leads and guides and comforts us on to the next thing.

BLUFF PARK UMC COMMUNITY HALLOWEEN DRIVE THRU!!!

Instead of our normal Community Halloween Carnival, we will be holding a Community Halloween Drive Thru this year on Wednesday, October 28th from 6:00-7:00pm in the Bluff Park UMC parking lot! Families in our community will be invited to drive through our church's parking lot, which will be filled with Halloween decorations, cars decorated for Halloween/Fall, music, lights, members of our church in costume, and/or members of our church waving signs. At the end of the drive thru, each child in each car will receive a bag of candy! While no one will be allowed to leave their cars as they drive through, we will encourage children to ride through in their costumes so they can show them off and interact with our members along the route!

We need your help in two ways to make this happen!

First, we need a TON of candy to make this event a success! The candy needs to be individually wrapped and cannot contain peanuts or peanut butter. If you would like to pick up a bag or two (or five!) to donate to the event, you can bring them to the church office Monday through Friday 8am-4pm. Or drop them off at the Welcome Center in the Narthex during in-person worship. We will be collecting until Wednesday, October 21st. If you would like to donate some money to buy candy instead of going out we have a link set up for that. The suggested amount it \$10 but we will of course be very grateful for any amount given. Second, we need you to participate. Here's how: **Please note, we will be following the current Covid protocol during this event (facemask, social distancing, etc.)**

- Families and Groups can sign up for 1 to 4 parking spots. You can park vehicles in those spots and decorate them "Trunk or Treat" style, or you can just decorate the area by putting a few tables and chairs out, signs, pumpkins, whatever you want to bring. We will be renting/buying a few generators for the event so let us know if you need access to electricity.
- Individuals that would like to volunteer can do so as well. We will need folks to direct traffic, hold signs, wave and say "Happy Halloween!" etc. Youth (6th grade and up) will be asked to join through BPUMC Students.
- Prizes will be awarded to the best booth/area by a group and to the best individual costume not in a group. The prize will be a great addition to any Sunday School classroom or home.

Family Worship



How To Worship Online


