During the upcoming holidays, however, your financial help is especially needed regarding water and utilities. We understand that there are now 12,000

customers in the greater Birmingham area that may have their water cut off due to unpaid bills. As people are struggling to make ends meet, the assistance with water bills can be a life saver! You can help by making financial gifts over and above your annual pledge to either the Pastor's Discretionary Fund at Bluff Park UMC or to Urban Ministry. If you choose to give to Urban Ministry, please make sure that the gift is clearly marked for "utility bill assistance" (i.e. in the memo line of a check). # CELEBRATING GIFTS AND YEAR-END GIVING

Churches typically receive as much as 25% of their gifts in the last two months of the year. As you make your plans to complete your 2020 financial commitment, here are three additional possibilities for resources beyond cash gifts. Please note that these possibilities are listed for educational purposes. Please consult your personal advisor for your specific information.

#### GIFTS OF APPRECIATED STOCKS OR BONDS

You can transfer ownership of stocks, bonds or mutual funds to the church and receive a charitable tax deduction based on the full fair market value of the securities on the date of the transfer. This avoids the capital gains tax while giving the church the benefit of the full value of the security. To receive this benefit, it is important to transfer ownership before the security is sold. For your gift to apply to the current tax year, the securities must be in the account of the local church (or our Foundation) by December 31st. So, allow plenty of lead time for your broker to complete this transaction.

### GIFTS OF REAL ESTATE

A charitable gift of real estate can be especially tax advantageous. If a home, vacation home, acreage or farm property has appreciated in value over the years – its sale could result in a sizable capital gains tax. If the real estate is given to the church prior to the sale, you can avoid the tax and realize a charitable deduction for the full fair market value of the real estate. One could even consider a bargain sale transaction with half of the funds to the church and the other half to the donor.

### GIFTS OF LIFE INSURANCE

When you name the church as the owner and beneficiary of a life insurance policy, it usually offers you a tax advantage in the year you make the gift. You can take a charitable deduction approximately equal to the cash value at the time of the gift. Additionally, continued payments of premiums may qualify as charitable tax deductions each year.

# **ADULT MINISTRY**

## History of the Advent Wreath

Advent is a season of waiting, expecting, and hoping. Beginning four Sundays prior to Christmas and ending on Christmas Eve, Advent helps us prepare for the coming, or "advent" of the Christ child at Christmas. For hundreds of years, Christians have used an Advent Wreath to inspire their hopes for the coming of Christ.

It's thought that the origins of the Advent wreath lie in the customs of people in the far northern countries of Scandinavia – customs that originated long before the birth of Christ. Because they couldn't do farm work outdoors in the winter, people brought the wheels of their wagons into their homes and decorated them with greens, put candles on them and hung them from the ceiling on a wire. They would then light the candles and twirl the wheel to become a glowing prayer to the god of light in this time of winter darkness.

Christians later adapted this custom to celebrate the coming birth of Christ, the Light of the World.

# PLEASE HELP OTHERS BY DONATING TO THE CHARITY OF YOUR CHOICE ON GIVING TUESDAY

(December 1st) or Anytime During December! Giving Tuesday is a day that encourages people to make charitable contributions. The day stands in contrast to Black Friday and Cyber Monday ~ the heavy shopping days after the U.S. Thanksgiving holiday. Since its beginning in 2012, Giving Tuesday has grown into a global movement that inspires hundreds of millions of people to give, collaborate, and celebrate generosity. Giving Tuesday is always five days after the U.S. Thanksgiving Day, so this year it falls on December 1.

The BPUMC family has an opportunity to be a part of this effort, and this year the CARES Act offers a new tax incentive. This law allows all taxpayers to take a charitable deduction of up to \$300, even if you do not itemize. In plain English, if you donate up to \$300 in cash to a qualified charitable organization like BPUMC, your adjusted gross income (AGI) will be reduced by up to \$300—and you can still claim the standard deduction. For those itemizing, the new law allows for cash contributions to qualified charities such as the church to be deducted up to 100% of AGI, up from 60% previously. This might be a good year to bunch multi-year gifts or to make a large cash gift to maximize both your deduction and impact the causes that matter to you.

In addition to BPUMC initiatives like the upcoming Capital Campaign and the Stained- Glass Repair fund, we have several missions/programs that are of special interest to our church family that need your prayers and contributions. If you would like to make a monetary donation to any of the following, please make your donation to BPUMC and indicate the name of the mission/program/project that the money is for.
